NCCU SCHOOL OF LAW JUVENILE LAW CLINIC

The North Carolina Central University School of Law Juvenile Law Clinic was established in recognition of the large number of Durham County youth who need quality legal and other support services because they have either been accused of violating school rules and are facing long-term school suspension or have been charged with a crime and are entering the juvenile justice system. The Clinic will provide four services: 1) legal representation for youth in delinquency hearings; 2) legal representation for youth in Durham Public School suspension hearings; 3) other support such as mentors and life skill training; and 4) in-home family counseling services. The goal of the program is to provide the youth and their families with consistent advocacy, education, and support services. By empowering the youth and their families through the services offered by the clinic, we hope to reduce the probability of continued delinquent behavior.

Law students provide direct legal services upon completion of the instruction and training on the North Carolina juvenile delinquency code, Durham County School Board policies and procedures, administrative procedures, and relevant state law pertaining to schools. Over the semester, the classroom component will consist of 40 to 50 hours of training and instruction, and the field component will consist of 50 to 60 hours. The Clinic is offered to second semester 2Ls and all 3Ls who complete or are concurrently enrolled in the prerequisite courses (criminal law, criminal procedure, civil procedure, evidence, and trial practice). (2 Credits).

The introduction class is scheduled to meet on Tuesday, August 26, 2003, 3:00 p.m. to 3:50 a.m. Classes are currently scheduled to meet twice a week; Tu-3 to 3:50 and Thurs-1 to 1:50 p.m. The class will meet at regularly scheduled class times in addition to six training sessions conducted on Fridays and Saturdays. For the Fall 2003 session, training will take place on September 5th, 6th, 12th, 13th, 26th, and 27th from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Once the training is complete, students will meet on an agreed upon day, once a week, for case rounds. Durham County Juvenile Court is held every other week of each month.

Services

Long Term Suspension Hearings

Under the supervision of experienced lawyers, law students provide direct legal services to Durham Public School students facing long-term suspension.

Juvenile Delinquency Hearings :

Under the supervision of experienced lawyers, law students provide direct legal services to Durham County youth who have been charged with a crime and are alleged to be delinquent. Juvenile delinquency cases are referred to the Clinic through the Durham County Public Defender's Office.

Mentor/Advocate and Life Skills Training Programs:

Youth may be assigned a mentor/advocate and where appropriate will be admitted to a life skills training program operated by the Durham P.R.O.U.D. Program. (Personal Responsibility to Overcome with Understanding and Determination). Life skills training may include tutoring and conflict resolution and anger management programs.

Family Development and In-Home Intervention Program:

The Clinic will provide to eligible families in-home counseling sessions over up to 12 weeks which may include systems-oriented therapy, parenting psycho-education, and advocacy and modeling for parents. This service is provided by family counseling specialists Parenting of Adolescents.

Community and Parent Education:

The Clinic will provide advocacy, education and support services not only to its juvenile clients but also to their parents, including parent advocacy training and education. Information and education sessions on the rights parents and children have associated with long-term suspensions will also be provided to community groups.
