> We're asking students to make an argument of no more than 1,500  
> words about a pertinent topic in the law, written in a style  
> that's accessible to general readers and lawyers alike. Entries,  
> which are due on December 1, 2004, will be judged by Legal  
> Affairs' editorial staff based on ingenuity of reasoning,  
> strength of evidence, and clarity and style of writing.

> Legal Affairs is the first general-interest magazine for lawyers  
> as well as non-lawyers. It publishes pieces that explore  
> important issues of law and justice, propose solutions, and

> regularly. Each issue presents a range of political and
